




Which idioms are represented in these pictures?



The water cycle

The heat of the sun 1 water to evaporate from seas, rivers and lakes. In addition, water vapour 2 is released from the soil and from plants. As the water vapour then 3 into the atmosphere, it cools and condenses into clouds. The clouds 4 are blown by winds until they 5 reach high ground. At this stage, the water droplets 6fall back to earth as rain, hail or snow. After rain has fallen on land, it either evaporates into the air or it 7 is absorbed by soils and plants. Some of it also 8 runs into rivers and lakes and eventually reaches the sea.


